MOUNT ST. HELENS FIELD TRIP (JLTGG)

TRIP LEADERS: WILLIAM SCOTT, JEFF TEPPER & MICHAEL MACHETTE

On this three-day tour of Washington's most active volcano we will examine deposits from the famous 1980 eruption as well as exposures that reveal its earlier history of both peaceful (lavas) and explosive activity. To participate you should be fit and have a basic knowledge of geology

Dates: Friday July 27 thru Sunday July 29, 2018.

Itinerary:

Friday. Half-day excursion. Arrive on your own by <u>12:30 pm</u> at Johnston Ridge Observatory (JRO) at Mount St. Helens (MSH) National Volcanic Monument. This is our starting point, and <u>timely arrival is critical</u>. Visit JRO followed by several hours of hiking in area. Leave about 4:30 pm.

Saturday. Meet at <u>8:30 am</u> with trip leaders at rest area in Cougar across the road from Lone Fir Resort. There is room at rest area to park cars for the day. Map out day's route and form carpools. Cars with 4 persons/vehicle means a 7-8 car caravan on Saturday and Sunday. See geology along eastern rim of MSH as far as Windy Ridge, 65 miles (2.5 hrs) one way; several hikes to see outcrops. Lunch will be supplied, but bring water, suntan lotion, etc. Return to Cougar for dinner. Dinner options are Lone Fir Café (smallish) or Cougar Bar and Grill, perhaps as a group.

Sunday. Half-day excursion. Meet at <u>8:30 am</u> as we did on Sat. See geology along southern side of MSH until about noon. Drive 25 miles one way (1 hr) to Ape and Lava Canyons. Return to participants cars in Cougar—end of trip. The return to Port Townsend is a 4 hour drive.

Driving: You get to the Friday starting point on your own. Lots of driving on Saturday on lengthy slow road around east side and approach to MSH. Sunday is a short tour, then off you go to wherever you wish.

Entry Pass required at JRO. A daily pass costs \$8. Annual and lifetime recreation passes are accepted (Annual Northwest Forest Pass, America the Beautiful, etc). Some other sites will also require a Daily or Annual Northwest Forest Pass for parking and hiking; one per vehicle. - **Meals:** A Saturday box lunch and beverage will be provided. Bring lots of water for yourself for the trip. Possible Group Dinner in Cougar on Sat. pm.
- **Lodging**. Everyone is responsible for finding their own lodging. This will be high season, and rooms are already being rapidly booked so it is essential that you make reservations as soon as possible. Note that driving time on Hwy 503 from Woodland (closest town) to Cougar is 45-60 min. Many motels along I-5 south from Castle Rock south to Woodland. Your lodging options include:
 - Lone Fir Resort in Cougar: (https://lonefirresort.com) has a few rooms and cabins; somewhat pricey.
 - VRBO, AirBnB, B&B, motels on I-5 or Hwy 503 within reasonable driving distance of Cougar.

 - Other more expensive options are available and can be found online.

Camping options: Tent/RV sites at Lone Fir Resort or nearby campgrounds. Other campgrounds near Cougar are operated by Pacificorp; see <u>http://www.pacificorp.com/about/or/washington.html</u> for information and to make reservations sooner rather than later.

- **Cost**: \$50 per person; check <u>must</u> accompany registration form. Refunds until July 1; thereafter you forfeit the \$50 per person. <u>All transportation, lodging, and meals (except Saturday lunch) are at participant's expense.</u>
- **Registration**: This will be a small trip (25± total participants). Registration is on a first-come basis, some standbys will be accepted. Print registration form below and return with check by snail mail.
